Another Parts Source.

Recently I was looking for parts for a couple A type overdrive units. The parts are "no longer available" from my normal supplier and were "out of stock" from other sources in US. I then recalled that Ron Fowler mentioned at the Christmas Party that there was a dealer in the UK that stocked Triumph parts and had good prices I emailed a note to Ron and he responded that I should check out Rimmer Bros at <u>www.rimmerbros.co.uk</u> Checked them out and found that they would mail me a catalogue. I signed up for one but haven't received it vet (it has only been about four weeks). They also have an online catalogue but the parts I wanted were not listed. They have a "Price" function where you enter the part number and they return the price. I tried that for the parts I needed and they returned two prices, one with VAT (Value Added Tax) and one without VAT. If it is shipped out of the UK, the VAT is not collected. The prices are quoted in British Pounds (). The current $1.0 \sim 1.60 . They claim that they are conversion is

equipped to ship anyplace in the word and you can email them for a quote on shipping charges.

My daughter happened to be working in the UK at the time so I sent her an email listing the parts I wanted and asked her to bring them home with her. She called the outfit but had a great deal of difficulty communicating with them. They have a very strong accent and they couldn't understand her at all. She finally tried the South Hampshire accent she is acquiring. Following is an example. "I ordered your bloody parts today. The gentlemen taking me order couldn't understand a word I said. I thought to meself, "Oh bugger this!" however, I patiently repeated meself bout ten times til he understood."

The correct parts were shipped to her. They even assigned her a customer number. Unfortunately, they spelled her name wrong --- but it is close. If she would have asked, they would have included the necessary paperwork to get a refund of the VAT at the airport. We'll be ready the next time.

Speaking of the next time, I measured her suitcase --- a typical woman's suitcase. A block and a crankshaft will both fit quite nicely. I will make good use of that customer number when she returns to the UK.

Still Planning For The Spring Tour

We could have moved it into May, but we decided to pull it back in front of Easter, on the 15th of April. It still will take up your day, we'll still do a lot of driving, and you'll still enjoy it. We'll (the Clough Family) will miss the start of the Bellbrook Maple Festival, that's all. A small price to pay for fun roads. Don't look for us to have a TR, I think the Merc's going to go on this – assuming that I get the power steering back together. Sad story that only Ford fans could love....

We'll still leave from Washington Court House's Bob Evans (a compromise for both Miami Valley Triumphs, Buckeye Triumph Club, and COCTRA – yes, all three clubs are invited – the more the merrier! Should I invite MG clubs also????). I hope the weather is decent so we can go to the parks I scoped out. Look for another flyer on this somewhere else in the newsletter.

The (Supposed) Triumphs Of Clifton

Several people have told me of a TR7 for sale in Clifton (Greene County) at a used car lot. Fine, last Sunday we were in Clifton so I decided to stop by, and sure enough, there it was – a '75 or '76 TR7 FHC. Not bad condition, I mean that I couldn't find any huge rust holes. But, but I wanted to talk to the owner so I decided to stop back the next day during my lunch hour. The owner wasn't there, so I stopped in a restaurant next door. *"Yup, call the owner's home phone listed on the door . Y'all interested in Triumphs?"* one of the folks in the place said. I indicated that I've owned a few in my days. He then proceeded to let me know about four more in the area. I had some time, so I headed back out for a Triumph Tour Of Clifton...

1. The TR7 parked on the corner turned out to be a '76 with about 40,000 miles on it. Red exterior with a tan interior. Interior wasn't bad, some facing to the plastic dash and the carpet wasn't original. The seat's weren't torn, and it had a dealer sun roof in it. On the exterior the car had been repainted (marginal - hood wasn't that good and it had some orange peel), and there had been rust repair in the quarters with the driver's rear still showing a bit of rust. The repaint was coming off in a few places on the top of the rocker panels and the window rubber could stand replacing. The floor pan was intact with no breaks where the trailing arms attached. It had a newer exhaust (cherry bomb front muffler with stock rear muffler), and the early four-speed was in it. Stock wheels and tires. I wrote down the phone number to call later. More on this towards the end of this article.

2. "Go up two streets, follow the road until it curves around, and there will be a GT6 on a trailer." Well, I went up two streets, turned down it, followed it way, way past the turn, but saw no GT6. Saw a couple of trailers that might have held a car, but no car. Reversed my tracks up and down a few side streets, but no GT6.. Oh well, on to #3.

3. "There's another TR7 up 72 a ways, not too far..." I took OH72 almost to Springfield. No TR7s, a tractor or two maybe, but no wedge. I did run into a couple of antique stores I may revisit on a tour sometime in the future (but they weren't open on Mondays...). Back to Clifton...

4. "A fellow on Wilberforce-Clifton road has a couple of GT6s for sale near the road, and right down from there a TR6 is for sale." I did find the GT6s on Wilberforce-Clifton road – rusty gutted hulks sitting next to a garage defended by a phalanx of pit-bulls. I don't think they were for sale, I

doubt anyone would buy them, and the dogs didn't look like "Bingo", "Fifi", and "Rover" were their names! The TR6 was a bit more interesting. Turns out it was a TR4 sitting in the backyard under a tarp. I've seen that car before! I think it belongs to a guy that used to be in the club, and used to live closer to Yellow Springs. He was a base photographer until laid-off. If it's his, the car is not for sale, and probably won't ever be. It used to be nice, but now it's under a tarp outside with what looks like a tonneau cover on it. Nobody was home, and the yard looked like it might harbor a pit-bull or alligator in some of the stuff, so I moved on.

I didn't find any more cars, so I headed back to work. Later that night I called on the TR7. Seems the current owner has had the car for a while, over 15 years, but it has only 40,000 miles on it. Yes, the head's been replaced (he moaned at what a bitch that was), and it was done a few years back. I asked if he retorqued the head every 1000 miles – he indicated he didn't know that was a needed thing. Yes, it's been repainted and has had some bodywork. done. Yes, it really does have the 4 speed in it (supposedly in good shape, but he has an extra 5-speed to throw in with the deal). The rest is original, and it has the original carbs on it. I asked him the price, "\$4200, but I'm willing to negotiate. That's what the books say it's worth." What books? I need to find those books since our TR4 must be worth \$30,000 by the same yardstick! I didn't have the heart to tell him that car's only worth \$1200 max (#4 car, and I'm being generous here) in all the old car price guides, probably \$800-\$1000 if he sold it at auction. Recipe Of The Month

JOBS FEARS AFTER 'ROVER SELL-OFF' REPORT By Alan Jones, Industrial Correspondent, PA News Fresh fears about the future of Rover cars and tens of thousands of jobs were raised tonight after German owner BMW refused to deny a report that it is to sell factories, including the huge Longbridge plant.

BMW said it had been working on a number of proposals to "re-structure" the Rover group, which employs thousands of workers at Longbridge in Birmingham, Cowley near Oxford and other UK plants.

The idea of selling the factories was one of a number of "conceivable variants" which will be discussed by the BMW supervisory board at a meeting in Munich on Thursday.

The statement immediately set alarm bells ringing among union leaders who said they were seeking urgent talks with the company.

Reports have regularly appeared in German magazines and newspapers over the past few months suggesting that the Rover subsidiary will be sold because of heavy losses but they have always proved unfounded.

But a new report in tomorrow's Suddeutsche Zeitung newspaper raised genuine concerns among union leaders.

The report said BMW would be presenting a plan to the board meeting to sell its Rover factories.

BMW said in its statement, issued in Munich tonight: "The board of management at BMW has been working on different scenarios to restructure the Rover group. "The company has reported regularly to the public about the current situation at Rover.

"The scenario referred to in the article as a plan is just one of the conceivable variants. The decision preferred by the board of management will be presented during the regular supervisory board meeting on Thursday the 16th and published afterwards."

BMW refused to expand on the statement but also refused to rule out any suggestion that it definitely would not be selling Rover. Sir Ken Jackson, general secretary of the Amalgamated Engineering and Electrical Union, said BMW had given assurances that it remained committed to Rover.

"Cash has already been pumped into Longbridge and this report will cause dismay throughout the Rover workforce because they just want to get on with their jobs and build cars.

"I am confident that BMW will remain committed to Rover but they have to make their position absolutely clear. It is time to remove any shadow of doubt about the future."

Tony Woodley, national officer of the Transport and General Workers Union, said he was seeking urgent talks with the company but believed that selling off Rover would not make any sense for BMW.

"It would also be unacceptable to the workforce and no doubt the British Government."

Garel Rhys of the Cardiff Business School, who is a leading motor industry analyst, said any suggestion that BMW was about to sell off Rover or any of its factories would be a surprise.

However, he added: "But the issue could well be on the agenda for Thursday's meeting."

Unions have warned that 50,000 jobs would be lost throughout the West Midlands if Longbridge closed. The Department of Trade and Industry tonight described the German newspaper report as "speculation".

Shadow trade and industry secretary Angela Browning said: "This is a blow for the Midlands when only last summer they had been anticipating a new era at Rover Cars.

"The key will be, if BMW does sell the company, who buys it and what sort of future they envisage."

Liberal Democrat trade and industry spokesman Vince Cable said: "In a European market that is seriously overcrowded with a lot of spare capacity, British car production has been put at a tremendous disadvantage by an overvalued pound. "Until Government policy brings the currency down to a realistic level against the euro this will not be the last of the damage to be inflicted on British industry."

The Sueddeutsche Zeitung newspaper said BMW had found a buyer for Rover, but that the German company would keep Land Rover and Mini. The paper said the buyer was not an established car manufacturer. The Birmingham Chamber of Commerce and Industry, which represents 5,000 firms across the city, said that, if true, the BMW move would be a devastating blow for the West Midlands region.

Spokesman John Lamb said the chamber had estimated that up to 50,000 jobs in the West Midlands economy were dependent on Longbridge's survival. Mr. Lamb added that he was particularly concerned at rumors that Rover could be sold off to venture capitalists rather than another automotive concern. He said closure of the Birmingham plant would result in a "disastrous" knock-on effect in the region, leading to tens of thousands of job losses in the components industry.

"It would affect the supply chain and there would be a domino effect which would be pretty devastating. That's the worrying part of it for us," Mr. Lamb added.

"We will just have to wait and see, but it would be devastating if its true." Birmingham Northfield MP Richard Burden, whose constituency covers Longbridge, tonight called on BMW to clarify its plans for the plant. Mr. Burden said BMW officials had personally assured him that they were committed to Longbridge "for the long term" with an investment strategy that would bring £500 million a year into Rover.

"Rumors in the press are not new," said Mr. Burden. "Indeed the most damaging thing for Rover over the past year has been constant rumor, speculation and counterrumor." He added: "What astonishes me today is that the latest reports circulating in the German press have not been conclusively denied by BMW. "That is why I am calling on BMW to put an end to the speculation and to reaffirm their commitment to Rover.

"In doing so I am asking them to do no more than to keep their word to me, to the British Government and the 50,000 people whose jobs depend on Longbridge."

My friends, you may think that this story doesn't perhaps impact on you and your Triumph cars, but don't you believe it. The name Triumph, your spare parts, and the license to produce them, is wholly owned by messrs BMW... BTW, I met Richard Burden, the Member of Parliament for the constituency that covers the Birmingham Longbridge plant, just this last Saturday, and he seemed pretty confident about BMW's intentions then...wow, what a difference, 3 short days can make!
