
Winner of the VTR Newsletter Award – 2003! and now 2005!

In addition, probably like everyone else, I have a fairly long list of maintenance items to complete on it during the winter months.

During the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, Sean suggested that we get some work done on the Spitfire. Fortunately it was very warm and pleasant to work out in the garage so I put the TV remote down and we set to work.

We put the brake lines on the chassis in preparation for installing the engine and transmission, something I didn't do when restoring the TR. Lessons learned. It's a lot easier to install the front lines when the engine in not in the way. However, when finishing the front lines on the Spitfire, we noted that a mistake had been made when assembling the front suspension so a couple of steps backwards had to be made. When it was all said and done, the shocks and springs had to be removed, bolts replaced and the shocks and springs reinstalled. Then we finished up the brake lines. By this time it was time for Sean to head back to school with the promise of returning this past weekend to finish installing the engine and transmission. This we did, although it was much colder in the garage this weekend. I have included a couple of pictures of the Spitfire thus far. When Sean comes home for Christmas break, maybe we will get a little more work done on it.


